Message from Chief Medina



Hello Albuquerque! I hope everyone enjoyed a spooktacular Halloween.

Homicides in Albuquerque have dropped 32% through October 2025, with 58 murders reported compared to 85 in 2024. APD homicide detectives have solved 84% of this year's cases, along with 25 from previous years, bringing the clearance rate to 132%. So far, 114 suspects have been charged, arrested, or are deceased, including a woman wanted for a 2019 murder that was solved earlier this year.

I would like to thank the homicide detectives who have worked tirelessly to bring justice to victims and their families, recognizing their dedication and hard work in solving these difficult cases.



POLICE TO RIDE

We hosted the 2nd Annual Dunkin' Donuts Cruiser event in celebration of National First Responders Day. We were joined by our officers, Albuquerque Fire Rescue, and Albuquerque Community Safety. More than 200 community members participated, including students from the Albuquerque Institute of Math & Science Charter School. We're excited to continue growing this event next year.


Going Somewhere?

Home Security during the Holidays

Burglars often target homes when they think no one is there. With the holiday season upon us, taking the time to give your home a once over, and a little preparation, can reduce the chances of unwanted visitors while you are away.

- Check all windows and doors to ensure they are locked and the alarm (if you have one) is armed.
- Schedule interior and exterior lights, and even TV and music, on timers; or activate them remotely. Lights left on all day can indicate that no one is home.
- Ensure packages, mail and newspapers are not delivered while you are away; or, ask a trusted neighbor to pick them up.
- If you're planning a long trip, ensure landscaping is maintained. A yard full
 of leaves is an indicator that the homeowner may be away.
- Don't publically announce your plans, or post pictures, online before or during your vacation.
- Asked trusted neighbors, friends and relatives to assist with checking on your home, including:
 - Removing flyers that may appear on your door.
 - Bringing the trash and recycling bins to the curb on regularly scheduled days.
 - Park in your driveway.
 - Apprise neighbors if someone will be visiting your home during your time away so they can readily identify and report suspicious activity.
 - Share contact information so they can communicate if there is a problem.
- Ensure your emergency contact information is up-to-date-with your alarm company and that your alarm is registered with the False Alarm Reduction Unit (505.758.2144, <u>faru@cabq.gov</u>).

ABQ 311

Help me clean up graffiti in our community and download the "ABQ 311" App. It's easy, if you see graffiti in our community stop in a safe area and take a photo. Pin your location and give a brief description of what and where the graffiti is located so our city employees can easily respond for clean-up.

Albuquerque Metro Crime Stoppers is a community program that relies on anonymous tips to solve crimes and to locate fugitives from justice. Without anonymity of callers, the program cannot be effective.

Crime Stoppers pays rewards only for anonymous tips. Tipsters who identify themselves are not eligible for a reward.

Crime Stoppers has sole discretion to decide the amount of any reward to be paid, from zero to \$1,000.

Crime Stoppers will pay rewards only for tips given directly to it. Any tip given to another source, such as law enforcement, will not be eligible for a Crime Stoppers reward.

Crime Stoppers does not pay rewards to any person who has a legal duty to assist in the arrest of suspects and fugitives.

Felony Gun Crime + Arrest = Up to a \$1,000 CASH REWARD
