As September comes to a close officers in the University Area Command have been working very hard in preparation for Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta beginning October 5 through October 15. Listed is a chart of activity from University Area Command officers for the month of September:

However, our city suffered a great loss on September 6, 2023 when a 10 year old male, Froylan Villegas, was leaving the Albuquerque Isotopes game and was tragically shot and killed. Details are limited but the incident began when two rival gangs noticed each other in an Isotopes baseball game (there was no confrontation inside Isotopes Park). The groups left the game when the offender group noticed a white Dodge truck leaving west on Avenida Caesar Chavez. The offender group began shooting at the white Dodge thinking the truck contained rival gang members. Tragically, the vehicle contained a family leaving the game and two innocent people were struck by gunfire, killing the Froylan.

Albuquerque Police Department Homicide detectives responded to the scene and within hours began to unravel the incident and identified three people they believe were responsible for the murder of Froylan. Thankfully, detectives were able to arrest the group as they traveled back into New Mexico with a significant amount of Fentanyl in their possession.

The City of Albuquerque suffered a great loss in the death of Froylan, but those who acted to shoot and kill Froylan have been arrested and will face justice for their actions.

There cannot be enough said for the tireless work Albuquerque Police Department Homicide detectives, who worked to bring justice to Froylan's family and ease the minds of people throughout Albuquerque who were heartbroken by this senseless act.



Help me clean up graffiti in our community and download the "ABQ 311" App. It's easy, if you see graffiti in our community stop in a safe area and take a photo. Pin your location and give a brief description of what and where the graffiti is located so our city employees can easily respond for clean-up.

Albuquerque Metro Crime Stoppers is a community program that relies on anonymous tips to solve crimes and to locate fugitives from justice. Without anonymity of callers, the program cannot be effective.

Crime Stoppers pays rewards only for anonymous tips. Tipsters who identify themselves are not eligible for a reward.

Crime Stoppers has sole discretion to decide the amount of any reward to be paid, from zero to \$1,000.

Crime Stoppers will pay rewards only for tips given directly to it. Any tip given to another source, such as law enforcement, will not be eligible for a Crime Stoppers reward.

Crime Stoppers does not pay rewards to any person who has a legal duty to assist in the arrest of suspects and fugitives.

Felony Gun Crime + Arrest = Up to a \$1,000 CASH REWARD


