



• Extra Help - Individuals with limited resources and income may be eligible to get Extra Help to help pay for Medicare Part D costs - monthly premiums (maximum \$22.84 for 2018), annual deductibles, and prescription co-payments.

**Did you know?**......You can change your Medicare Prescription Drug Plan if you qualify for Extra Help. This is helpful if your prescriptions change and your current plan may not cover the new prescriptions.

- **Special Lump Sum Death Payment** deceased's family members may be able to receive Social Security benefits along with a one-time payment of \$255 to the surviving spouse.

**Medicare Fall Open Enrollment** - Every year from October 15 to December 7, anyone with Medicare can enroll in a Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Plan or change plans. Other changes may also be made beginning in 2019 during January 1 and March 31. (See page 16)

If you missed your **Medicare Initial Enrollment Period (IEP)** when you first were qualified for Medicare, you may apply for Medicare Part A and/or Medicare Part B during the General Enrollment Period, January 1 to March 31 each year. If you enroll in Medicare during the General Enrollment Period, your coverage begins in July. (See page 16).

The **Bernalillo County Assessor's Office** can verify if you may be eligible for a tax exemption or property valuation freeze. (See page 6).
