

The City of Albuquerque's Department of Senior Affairs (DSA) is thrilled to bring you this 2023 edition of the Quick Guide to Senior Services. With the COVID-19 pandemic almost in the rear-view mirror, we feel extremely hopeful and optimistic as we continue to pursue our mission centered on care and compassion of helping our neighbors thrive while aging.

This guide serves as an important tool for our community -- especially as we engage in the process of reconnecting with many of our pre-pandemic community partners -- all in an effort to provide you and your family with the most up-to-date information possible.

DSA has taken intentional steps to put the lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic into action, as well to meet the evolving needs of our community as more seniors desire to age in place and continue living independently. We are proud to live in a city that champions the positive aging of older adults and recognizes the need to change and adapt as the population ages.

This includes finding new ways to leverage our Senior and Multigenerational Centers to improve the overall health and well-being of Albuquerque's older adult population – from hosting technology workshops to expanding our meal programs for those 60 and older. DSA has also refined its practices to better accommodate the growing need for popular services such as our Home Services program and expanded Senior Transportation options. Already, we have seen participation in many of our programs return to pre-pandemic levels, including many of our fitness and wellness offerings. In addition, we will continue our work to ensure that our seniors are well-informed and well-protected against illnesses like COVID-19 and influenza by expanding access to vaccine clinics at our Centers, thanks in part to a grant the Department was recently awarded by the National Council on Aging (NCOA).

CASE MANAGEMENT

The CASE MANAGEMENT program links seniors and un-paid caregivers to critical support services.

The **Case Management** program (CM) is a client-centered, social model of case management. The approach is to identify and arrange appropriate support services that meet basic needs, promote independent living, and enhance quality of life.

Case Management functions as a link between the client, family caregivers, and service providers to facilitate an appropriate, comprehensive, and coordinated response to needs and maximize all resources and services available in the community to meet these needs.

Services are provided at no cost. Individuals with the greatest economic or social need are prioritized.

To be eligible for services, one must live in Albuquerque/Bernalillo County and be age 60 and older; or be an unpaid caregiver of someone age 60 and older. For some services, other eligibility criteria may exist.

Referrals for services are made by a Case Management Coordinator only after the completion of an in-home assessment to determine eligibility.

Area Agency on Aging Funded Services*		
Adult Day Care	Adult Day Care is designed to support and assist family caregivers so they may continue to care for their loved one in good health with minimal stress, preventing or delaying the need for institutionalization.	
Home Delivered Meals	Home Delivered Meals support goals of improving or maintaining senior health and decreasing feelings of isolation through sound nutrition and informal safety checks.	
Homemaker	Homemaker services aid with shopping, money management, light housework, preparing meals, some transportation and errands, personal care and supervision to persons needing help with daily living activities like bathing, grooming, eating, dressing, etc.	
Home Services	Home Services performs chores, repairs, and retrofit to promote independent living (see next page).	
Respite (In-Home Care)	Respite services provide brief periods of relief or rest for non-paid caregivers. Both caregiver and care recipient are registered.	
AmeriCorps Seniors Funded Services		
Senior Companion Program	Senior Companion Program (SCP) matches senior volunteers with clients experiencing isolation and loneliness. SCP volunteers provide friendship, assistance, and companionship and may run errands or accompany clients on outings.

HOME SERVICES

The **HOME SERVICES** program performs chores, repairs, and retrofit to promote safe, independent living.

The HOME SERVICES program does not perform cosmetic services or services requiring a license.

Materials and/or equipment are provided unless otherwise noted. Services are provided at no cost. Donations are welcomed; however, no one is denied services based on their inability to donate. Individuals with the greatest economic or social need are prioritized.

To be eligible for services, one must live in Albuquerque/Bernalillo County and be age 60 and over. Some services are limited based on availability or other eligibility criteria as indicated by the following categories.

SILVER ALERT SYSTEM



The **SILVER ALERT** System helps caregivers and families find missing loved ones who may not be aware of their surroundings or who have wandered due to cognitive impairment.

WHAT IS SILVER ALERT?

Enacted in 2013, SILVER ALERT is patterned after the Amber Alert. Instead of missing children, this alert informs the public about endangered, missing adults over the age of 50, with irreversible cognitive impairments such as Alzheimer's or other dementia.

HOW DOES SILVER ALERT WORK?

The SILVER ALERT System works much like an Amber Alert. The at-risk missing person is reported to law enforcement. Responding officers may ask for personal information that indicates the person has dementia or other cognitive impairments. Caregivers will be asked to provide details that will help locate the missing or endangered loved one.

After verification, police inform the state agency tasked with issuing alerts. In many states, including New Mexico, the Department of Public Safety is able to issue alerts. Once issued, the alert is displayed on electronic highway signs as well as broadcast on radio and television as well as various social media outlets. Time is of the essence in these situations.

SILVER ALERT is a valuable way to help ensure loved ones safety before further harm can come to them.

HOW TO REPORT SOMEONE MISSING THAT FALLS UNDER THE SILVER ALERT LAW:

- CONTACT law enforcement immediately.
- INFORM the dispatch officer your loved one has dementia, Alzheimer's or other cognitive impairment.
- KEEP a current photo, description and vital medical info to quickly give it to law enforcement.

Plan ahead...

The Department of Senior Affairs can provide families with a **FREE** portable USB drive and assist in storing the following information:

- · A recent photograph
- Description information
- Important medical information

In the event their loved one at risk, wanders and is missing, caregivers can provide the USB drive to Albuquerque Police Department officers with their loved one's vital information. VIAL OF LIFE PROGRAM



The **Vial of Life** program is a universal, smart way to have personal medical information on hand in case of an emergency. This could be critical for older adults living alone, especially those with constant medical changes and medications. The **Vial of Life** is designed to speak for someone when they can't speak for themselves. The **Vial of Life** kit contains important medical information that can assist emergency personnel in administering the proper medical treatment.

HOW DOES VIAL OF LIFE WORK?

The Vial of Life program is a simple four step process:

- Individuals can complete the form which has instructions in English, Spanish and Vietnamese with their current medical information.
- Place the completed form into the "vial" or baggie.
- Place the baggie on the refrigerator door using the Vial of Life decal magnet.
- Affix the Vial of Life sticker decal on your front door or window, whichever is most visible for first responders.

Since the Vial of Life is a universal program, first responders know where to look for vital medical information.

In the event of an emergency, the stress or trauma of the unexpected event can make it almost impossible to think straight. At these times, it is imperative all emergency personnel get the information they need—especially if the individual has a complex medical history. The benefit of this program goes beyond just helping older adults but can benefit anyone with any medical condition that first responders need to know about. It is important to be prepared and the **Vial of Life** form can also be stored in vehicles or backpacks. It also serves as an important piece of communication during the exchange from emergency transport to emergency room personnel.

50+ RECREATION, SPORTS & FITNESS



Albuquerque's older adults can enjoy sports and recreation activities, the arts, unlimited learning opportunities, trips and outings, meals, special events and support groups at any of the Metro area's eight centers.

Educational and social activities include: computing, health management, musical concerts, lectures, theater, pottery, breakfast, lunch, and support groups. Recreational and sports activities include hiking, down-hill skiing, aerobics, and a range of other indoor and outdoor sports and fitness opportunities.

50+ Sports & Fitness

Regular physical activity and exercise for older adults help improve mental and physical health, both of which will help you maintain your independence as you age. As a Department of Senior Affairs member, you can take advantage of our sports and fitness facilities, classes, and trips. The Department of Senior Affairs 50+ Sports & Fitness Program includes individual and group weight training classes; aerobic, gentle, and flex tone exercise classes; water exercise; an outdoor recreation program; evidenced-based programs; and the Albuquerque 50+ Games. New classes and opportunities are added regularly.

Senior Affairs Membership

All Department of Senior Affairs Senior, Multigenerational and Fitness Centers operate on a membership basis. Memberships help us keep accurate count of participants, as well as help make sure we obtain appropriate resources and funding to continue providing free and low-cost services to our active adult community.

Annual membership cost is \$20 however, a fee waiver can be requested. Members have access to fitness programs, classes, travel, meals, computer labs, volunteer opportunities, competitive sports events and more.

If you have an active membership at one location, you are entitled to participate in programs and activities at any other senior and multigenerational centers. If a trip or class is filled at your home center, a similar trip or class may be available to you at another. Senior centers are available for anyone age 50 and older and Multigenerational Centers are for anyone age 6 and older, including seniors.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENT TRANSPORTATION

MONDAY-FRIDAY

Medical appointment rides are always considered priority and are scheduled 7-days in advance to appointment date. Transport is available to Presbyterian Rust Medical Center in Rio Rancho for Bernalillo County residents. "Call when ready" return rides must be called in by 5:00pm in the greater Albuquerque area and by 4:00pm in the East Mountain/Cedar Crest area. SENIOR, MULTIGENERATIONAL AND MEAL SITE TRANSPORTATION

MONDAY-FRIDAY

Seniors can request daily pick up from their homes within a five-mile radius to all City of Albuquerque's senior and multigenerational centers and Bernalillo County meal sites. We also offer transport within a six-mile radius to Whispering Pines and Tijeras Senior Center. To utilize meal site transport services, individuals can register directly with their center site.

PROPERTY TAX INFORMATION

- **Head of Household Exemption** allows \$2,000 of the taxable value of a residential property to be tax exempt if certain criteria are met.
- Value Freeze Program allows seniors age 65 or older a freeze on the valuation of their property for the purposes of property taxes. The property owner must have had a Modified Gross Income In 2022 of \$40,400 or less, and be either: 65 years-of-age or over; or disabled.
- Veteran Tax Exemption A \$4,000 reduction in the taxable value of real property for any veteran or unmarried surviving spouse who served a minimum of 90 consecutive duty days (other than training), and who was honorably discharged and a legal resident of New Mexico.
- **Disabled Veteran Tax Exemption** Grants a 100% property tax waiver on the veteran's primary residence to any veteran who has been determined to have 100% total and permanent service-connected disability by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, and who Is a legal resident of New Mexico.

• Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries (QMB's)

Category 041 (over 65) Category 044 (under 65)

Entitles individuals to payment of Medicare premiums as well as the deductible and coinsurance amounts on Medicare-covered services. To be eligible, the applicant must already have, or be conditionally eligible for Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance), and their income must be below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). See next page for FPL Guidelines.

• Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiaries (SLIMB's) / Qualified Individuals (QI1's)

Category 042 and Category 045

Entitles individuals to payment of their Medicare Part B premiums. To be eligible, the applicant must already have Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance). See next page for FPL Guidelines.

- SLIMB (Category 045) Income Level is 100% 120% of the FPL.
- QI1 (Category 042) Income Level is 120 % -- 135% of the FPL.
- Working Disabled

<u>Category 050 Qualified Disabled Working Individuals (QD)</u>

Entitles individuals (under age 65) to payment for their Medicare Part A Premium whose income is below 200% of the FPL Guidelines. See next page for FPL Guidelines. The resource limit is \$4,000 for an individual.

To Qualify for QD the individual needs to meet the following:

- 1.) Must be under age 65.
- 2.) lose entitlement to free Medicare Part A due to substantial gainful employment.
- 3.) continue to meet the Social Security (SSA) disability criteria; and
- 4.) be enrolled for premium Part A Medicare.

Category 074 Working Disabled Individuals (WDI's)

Provides full coverage Medicaid to disabled working individuals. Individuals must meet the Social Security Administration's (SSA) criteria for disability without regard to "substantial gainful activity" and their income is 250% FPL for a single and couple. See below for FPL Guidelines.

MEDICAID: Individuals become eligible for New Mexico Medicaid when they meet the specific criteria for one of the eligibility categories. Regulations for New Mexico's Medicaid programs are promulgated by the Federal Department of Health and Human Services under Title XIX of the Social Security Act as amended and by the New Mexico Human Services Department, Medical Assistance Division. The Department's Income Support Division offices make eligibility determinations for Medicaid, except for those categories administered by the Social Security Administration.

AFFORDABLE CARE ACT CATEGORIES: Category 100 Other Adult

Covers individuals age 19 up to 65, with or without dependents with no Medicare entitlement who meet non-financial and financial criteria. Income must be less than 133% FPL for the household size. There is no resource test for this category.

SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME (SSI) EXTENSION

Categories 001, 003, and 004

The Social Security Administration determines eligibility for these categories. SSI provides cash benefits and Medicaid provides health care coverage for eligible individuals under aged (Category 001), blind (Category 003), or disabled (Category 004). The maximum monthly income benefits provided under this program are \$841 for an individual and \$1,261 for a couple. Resource limits are \$2,000 for an individual and \$3,000 for a couple.


Foster Grandparents: Help Children Succeed!
