## **Department of Senior Affairs**

#### PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

(Section 2.9: B-C; Revised March 2020)

In order that all users may have a pleasant experience at the center, participants are expected to respect the rights of others and to adhere to the following behaviors:

- 1. Maintain personal hygiene that is not offensive or unhealthy.
- Does not harass or bully other participants and/or staff, with racial slurs, verbal abuse, or sexual harassment.
   Participants must show consideration for the diversity of staff and other participants.
- 3. Does not use voice and behavior that will disturb other center participants.
- 4. Does not use language and behavior that other participants and staff will find obscene, abusive or sexually offensive. This includes, but is not limited to in person, by telephone or email.
- 5. Show courtesy to other participants and staff; respect decision made by center management and bring issues involving the operations of the center to management's attention for resolution.
- 6. No unlawful weapons are allowed in City facilities.
- 7. Fighting between participants or with a staff person is prohibited.
- 8. Smoking is prohibited in City facilities or on City premises.
- 9. Alcohol consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in City facilities.
- 10. Treat Center materials, equipment, furniture, grounds, and facility with respect.
- 11. Use the Senior Center and Senior Center equipment in a safe and appropriate manner.
- 12. Keep the Senior Center building and grounds neat, clean, and litter free.

Failure to observe rules of conduct may result in disciplinary action being taken against participants, up to and including suspension from the program.

In the Spotlight for the month of April is Friends' member David Wesley.

David was born in Brady, Montana, which is 20 miles from the Canadian border. He attended the University of Montana at Missoula; he received a BS in Marketing and Management. He worked three jobs to pay for his college.

David went to Viet Nam in 1967. He received the Combat Infantry Badge and the Viet Nam Service Medal with a Bronze Star. He also received the Viet Nam Defense Medal and the rank of Sergeant (E-5). He is a 100% disabled combat veteran. He says he is lucky to be alive and believes his purpose in life is to help other veterans navigate the VA system.

In high school, David performed in rodeos. He rode bare back broncos and brahma bulls. In later years he raised quarter horses and fillies. He was also a farmer and rancher. He worked for Exxon in Albuquerque. He also worked as a developer for Dale Bellamah Homes and Roger Cox & Associates. He formed the Blue Cow Referral Company LLC. He has 2 partners; he provides the contacts for them and they buy and sell real estate.

David's hobbies include riding a motorcycle, hunting, fishing, and playing golf. He lives in Cedar Crest. He met Dorian Kirk here at Bear Canyon and they have been together for a year.






