PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

(Section 2.9: B-C; Revised March 2020)

In order that all users may have a pleasant experience at the center, participants are expected to respect the rights of others and to adhere to the following behaviors:

- 1. Maintain personal hygiene that is not offensive or unhealthy.
- Does not harass or bully other participants and/or staff, with racial slurs, verbal abuse, or sexual harassment.
 Participants must show consideration for the diversity of staff and other participants.
- 3. Does not use voice and behavior that will disturb other center participants.
- 4. Does not use language and behavior that other participants and staff will find obscene, abusive or sexually offensive. This includes, but is not limited to in person, by telephone or email.
- 5. Show courtesy to other participants and staff; respect decision made by center management and bring issues involving the operations of the center to management's attention for resolution.
- 6. No unlawful weapons are allowed in City facilities.
- 7. Fighting between participants or with a staff person is prohibited.
- 8. Smoking is prohibited in City facilities or on City premises.
- 9. Alcohol consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in City facilities.
- 10. Treat Center materials, equipment, furniture, grounds, and facility with respect.
- 11. Use the Senior Center and Senior Center equipment in a safe and appropriate manner.
- 12. Keep the Senior Center building and grounds neat, clean, and litter free.

Failure to observe rules of conduct may result in disciplinary action being taken against participants, up to and including suspension from the program.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

BEAR CANYON CRAFTERS HELP REFUGEES

A dedicated group of knitters and crocheters meet at Bear Canyon each week. Their purpose is to create and donate blankets for sick and distressed children. The children arriving from Afghanistan are certainly troubled. They had to leave everything behind when they came to the United States. In September and October, the Bear Canyon blankets as well as blankets from other "blanketeers" were given to Fort Bliss and Alamogordo Air Force Base for the Afghan refugees. The blankets were a source of comfort and pleasure for the displaced children. Over 650 blankets, donated by blanketeers all over Bernalillo County, were sent to these bases in southern New Mexico.

This effort was coordinated by the Bernalillo County's Project Linus chapter. (http://www.projectlinus.org) The chapter is part of a national non-profit organization based is Belton, Missouri. Project Linus has two missions:

- First, it is their mission to provide love, a sense of security, warmth and comfort to children who are seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need through the gifts of new, handmade blankets and afghans, lovingly created by volunteer "blanketeers".
- Second, it is their mission to provide a rewarding and fun service opportunity for interested individuals and groups in local communities, for the benefit of children.



Both missions apply to the Bear Canyon crafters. The group enjoys the company of like-minded volunteers and a chance to contribute to a worthwhile cause doing something they enjoy.

CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE/BERNALILLO COUNTY
AREA AGENCY ON AGING OLDER AMERICANS PROGRAM
FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2022 TO JUNE 30, 2026
