A Message From Our Center Manager

Hello all and welcome to 2023! With a new year, we'd like to start with some exciting news:

In an effort to increase accessibility to the senior lunch program, effective January 3, 2023, all City of Albuquerque senior and multigenerational centers, including Bear Canyon, will offer a donation-based lunch for adults aged 60 and older.

What does donation-based mean? -

• Registered center members years 60+ are eligible for the "hot meal" / "main entrée" on a donation basis. A donation is appreciated but not required, however, reservations are still required. For questions or information, please do not hesitate to visit with our front desk staff.

Furthermore, kitchen renovations start this month! We do not anticipate the construction, to have much impact on our classes and activities, however, there will be some temporary adjustments to the senior meal program including availability of breakfast and a la carte menu items. Adjustments will include the following:

- Starting January 9th, we will be providing dine in meals here at the center that will be delivered daily from our department's main central kitchen. To ensure we have enough meals on site, it is important reservations are made daily for the following day.
- Temporarily, breakfast and a la carte menu items will be unavailable. We apologize for any inconvenience.

Our main goal is to keep everyone updated and we appreciate everyone's patience and flexibility throughout the duration of the project.

SCP supports volunteers so they can assist frail elderly clients in their home, helping with errands, light grocery shopping, and simply spending time providing companionship and friendship. Volunteers may also provide respite service to family members. All it takes to be a volunteer is: be 55 or older, willing to serve a minimum of ten hours per week, pass a fingerprint-based background check, and enjoy working with elderly adults in need of assistance. When you join SCP, you can become eligible to earn a non-taxable stipend, mileage, and meal reimbursements, supplemental accident and liability insurance while on duty, access to training, conferences and recognition throughout the year. Happy New Year!

As we start 2023 off together, I want to take some time to share an exciting update from the Department of Senior Affairs.

Effective January 3, 2023, all City of Albuquerque senior and multigenerational lunch sites will offer free/donation based senior lunch service to adults age 60+ Monday-Friday 11:30AM – 1:00PM. In an effort to increase accessibility to our lunch program, we are adding additional site locations in our City. New locations are Highland Senior Center, Palo Duro Senior Center and Bear Canyon Senior Center.

We also want to remind adults 60+ that transportation is provided from their homes to a senior meal site within a five-mile radius to all City of Albuquerque and Bernalillo County meal sites. We offer transportation within a six-mile radius to Whispering Pines and Tijeras Senior Center meal sites. To utilize meal site transport services, individuals can register directly with their closest center site. It is our goal to continue providing the best services, programs and resources for Albuquerque's older adult population and we are looking forward to another year of health and happiness!

PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

(Section 2.9: B-C; Revised March 2020)

In order that all users may have a pleasant experience at the center, participants are expected to respect the rights of others and to adhere to the following behaviors:

- 1. Maintain personal hygiene that is not offensive or unhealthy.
- Does not harass or bully other participants and/or staff, with racial slurs, verbal abuse, or sexual harassment.
 Participants must show consideration for the diversity of staff and other participants.
- 3. Does not use voice and behavior that will disturb other center participants.
- 4. Does not use language and behavior that other participants and staff will find obscene, abusive or sexually offensive. This includes, but is not limited to in person, by telephone or email.
- 5. Show courtesy to other participants and staff; respect decision made by center management and bring issues involving the operations of the center to management's attention for resolution.
- 6. No unlawful weapons are allowed in City facilities.
- 7. Fighting between participants or with a staff person is prohibited.
- 8. Smoking is prohibited in City facilities or on City premises.
- 9. Alcohol consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in City facilities.
- 10. Treat Center materials, equipment, furniture, grounds, and facility with respect.
- 11. Use the Senior Center and Senior Center equipment in a safe and appropriate manner.
- 12. Keep the Senior Center building and grounds neat, clean, and litter free.

Failure to observe rules of conduct may result in disciplinary action being taken against participants, up to and including suspension from the program.



Happy New Year. As 2023 begins, we would like to reintroduce you to your own local nonprofit, the Friends of Bear Canyon. We are, like you, seniors who enjoy the many benefits that the Bear Canyon Senior Center has to offer. Beyond that, the Friends of Bear Canyon are 22 senior volunteers who, through our one-of-a-kind nonprofit organization, raise funds throughout the year to help pay for many special needs of our seniors that are not covered within the Senior Center's budget.

We buy things that benefit individual clubs and groups, and we buy things that benefit everyone. We buy little things like yarn, guitar strings, ping pong balls and a waffle maker and toaster for the kitchen. We buy big things like a piano, a big screen TV, a popcorn machine for social gatherings and, for all of us, a high-speed modem/router to provide WiFi throughout the Senior Center.

As needed, we organize and help pay for the Friendship Coffee held each Tuesday morning -- and personally serve you the coffee and pastries with a smile. We arrange the monthly fundraising lunches held at local restaurants so that you can share a meal with old friends and maybe make some new ones. You will see us at tables in the lobby selling Holiday raffle and carwash tickets throughout the year.


