Now that I am retired, the smiles and hugs come from my four grandchildren.


I love spending time with them and watching them learn new things. I am blessed to have them in my life!





I love my grandma and spending time with her. She worked hard to be where she is today and she still does. This is why I chose to interview her, because she's hard working.








