\$3.5 million in grant funding for electric buses

Albuquerque LEED Silver Certified

Updated to 2018 City Energy Conservation Code

Negotiated Solar Direct Program securing 25 MW solar energy

Provided 300 low income homes with free energy audits and upgrades


On track for 80% renewable energy use by end of 2021
