All	60	<p>Discussion of the following issues :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trend & Web Sense • The Virus/Trojan/Worm Wars: <p>Per Clint: csrss.exe is especially mean. It's a Trojan that cannot be deleted or cleaned. It destroys the restore and backup capability. It prevents re-installation of the OS. Comes in thru SPAM – click a link or image, or via attachment. Also loads via infected websites. You know you've got it when your CPU goes to 100%. Our only option has been to re-image. My question is, since we can't control behavior, can we control the links in email or email attachments? Can we de-activate the links? Can we scan/clean attachments? Some outfits (e.g., FBI) don't allow attachments. Would it help if we were on Active Directory and able to manage the desktop?</p> <p>Per Dianna Coleman-Tech Support:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Windows 2007/XP/bytes. • Windows 7 needs Active Directory ISD purchased 16 Window 7 licenses for the testing committee and now we're ready to push it out to your pc and start testing. <p>Windows 7 has Office 27 as a Standard. We have a list of applications that need to be tested in Windows 7. Windows 7 should be installed from scratch.</p> <p>It was decided at the TRC meeting that we need to get to the point where we can get Windows 7 delivered on new PCs. One of the things that is holding us up is that ISD needs to develop procedures for Computer Corner to use in deploying new PCs. So between now and next Thursday's Windows 7 Testing Committee meeting, my group in ISD will be working on a recommendation for procedures that will allow Computer Corner to setup new PCs with Windows7. That would mean that departments that do their own deployments may need to be aware of that, depending on whether they use ISD's Novell servers for file sharing.</p> <p>I believe that everyone will be pleased with not downgrading to Windows XP, so it is anticipated that as of next Thursday there will be procedures worked out to deploy new City PCs with Windows 7. Test group will figure out the best resolution for 64 vs. 32.</p> <p>Per Tony Schupp: Propose to meet weekly with your test team.</p>
