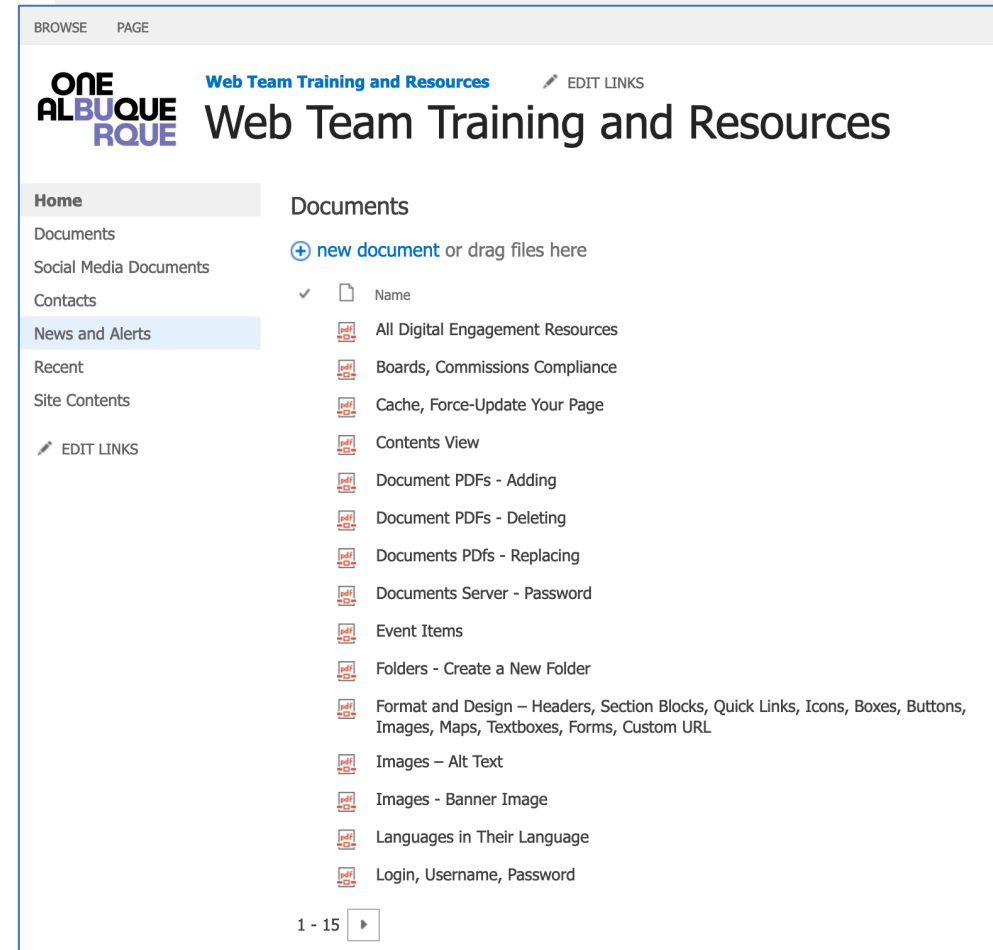
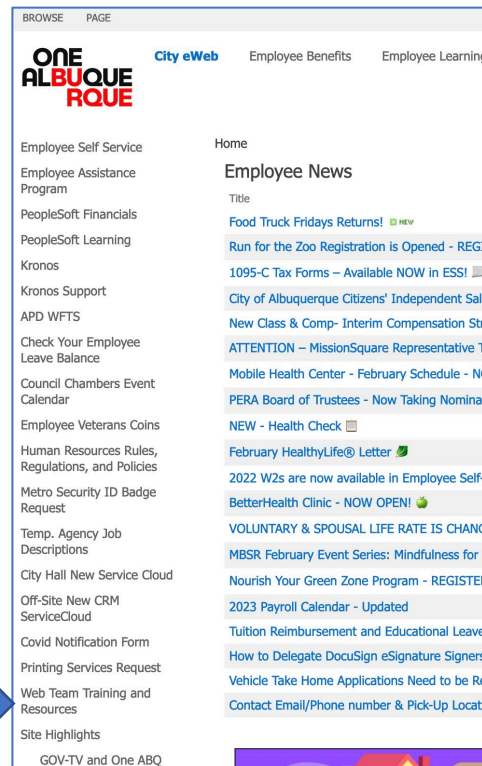

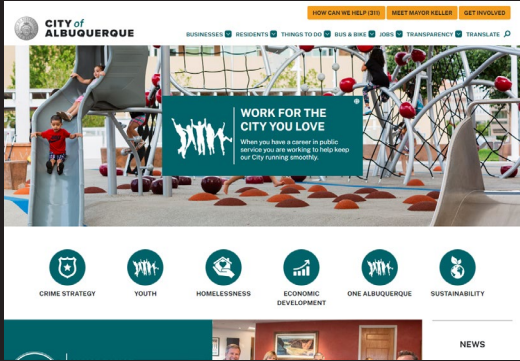

Accurate: all information must be up-to-date!

Outdated information is found first.
Folks will find your outdated PDFs, pages, images ... everything. Remove or update information regularly.

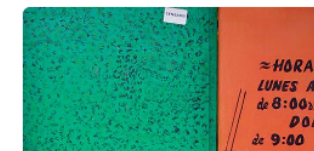
Public: all current public information, or how to receive information from the City, should be posted to the website.

Accessible: Must be accessible to all users no matter their physical ability or device they use.

Language Materials

Our team is committed to language barriers barriers for our community to ensure equitable access to city information. Our City has to offer.

In December 2021, City Council voted unanimously to increase language access to ensure documents were more available for non-English speaking residents. The City of Albuquerque is committed to ensuring access to city information in the most common languages spoken by its diverse population. To this end, we have begun to translate the most vital documents and forms we use. However, there is new information on our City website, and for that, we must rely on Google Translate. Although not perfect, Google Translate is getting better. This help page provides basic instructions and a disclaimer. Below, we give you information for how to ask the City of Albuquerque municipal government for an interpreter or for specific documents to be translated. - Screen readers convert content to synthetic speech.
- Information must be presented in linear order, brief, and not redundant.
- Finding, navigation & orientation

WCAG – PDFs



We have more than 12,000 PDFs on the website.

Do you need a PDF?

- A PDF is for or printing, otherwise use text on a page.

PDFs have to have the same formatting structure as a webpage.

99% of PDFs are unusable to anyone using an assistive device.

Every PDF will need to be updated or converted to:

- Text on Page
- Fillable Form
- Accessible PDF

WCAG – Alt Text for Images

Every digital image has to have an Alt Text attribute

Alt Text Should:

- Convey Meaning
- Be Accurate & Equivalent
- Be Succinct
- Not be Redundant
 - Null attribute – open and closed quotes (“”),
Screen reader skips over image
 - All text should be on the page

Ask yourself, if the image were deleted, what important content would be lost?

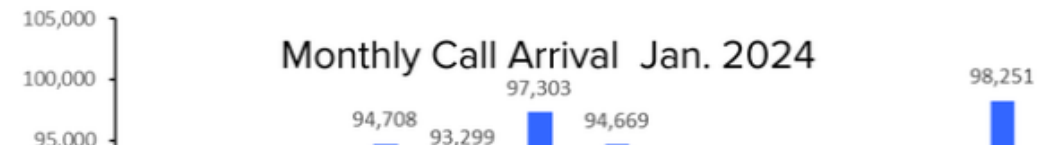

Clear, Concise & Common

- Logical Order
- Headers in order – as many as you need as long as they are in order and begin with Header 2

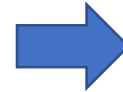

- Do not underline text, underlining is for links only.

Construction Contact, Process & FAQ

While the City is not performing the construction work, it ensures that all projects are properly permitted and meet required standards.

Private fiber providers are responsible for construction, which will take place over the next few years. Work will be expected to be performed in neighborhoods, side streets, and major roads, primarily within public rights-of-way, including sidewalks, curbs, and property lines. Construction is performed by crews contracted by the private fiber providers and the individual fiber providers are responsible for construction.

This explains what to expect during construction and how fiber internet will improve connectivity across the city.

Temporary paint and flags may be placed by NM 811 to mark underground utilities. Please do not remove these markings — they prevent accidental damage.



Links - Formatting

Link text needs to be highlighted then added, not copy and pasted from a document. This will break links!

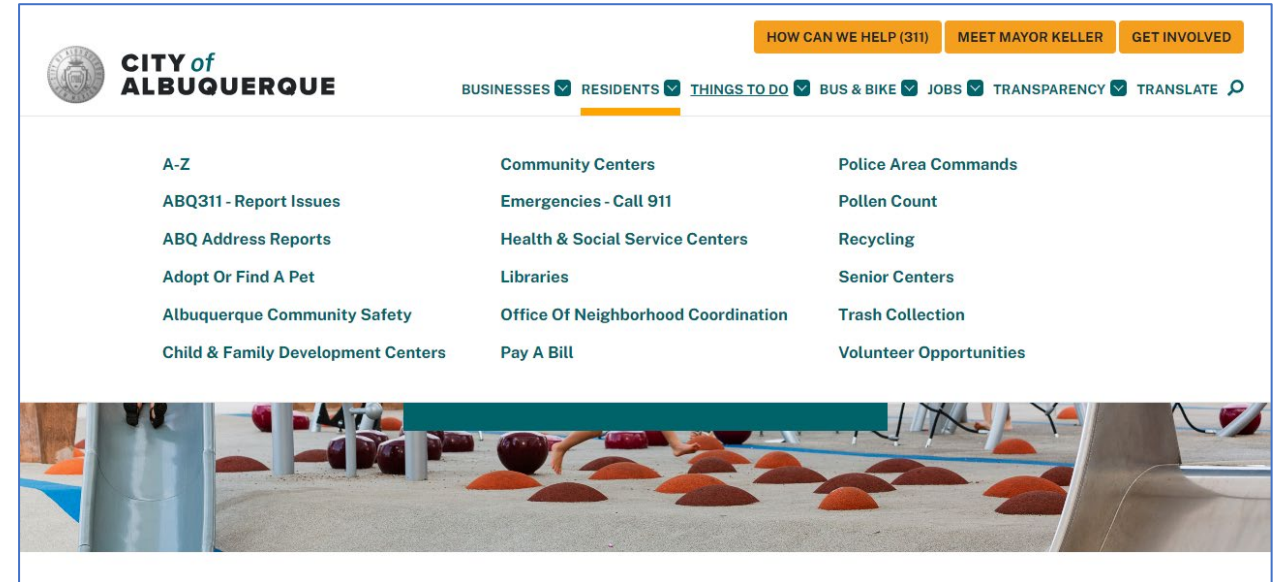


Why Do Users Visit cabq.gov? People visit cabq.gov to get something done.

Knowing why users visit your site helps to determine how to organize your information.

Below is some of the most sought information on the website. It shows the task users want to accomplish and the tool they use to do it. Notice that it is **not information about a service** that is needed, but **how** to complete the task and **answers** to questions.

- Task: get to work, tool: bus routes

- Task: adopt a puppy, tool: view photos

- Task: stay healthy, tool: air quality report



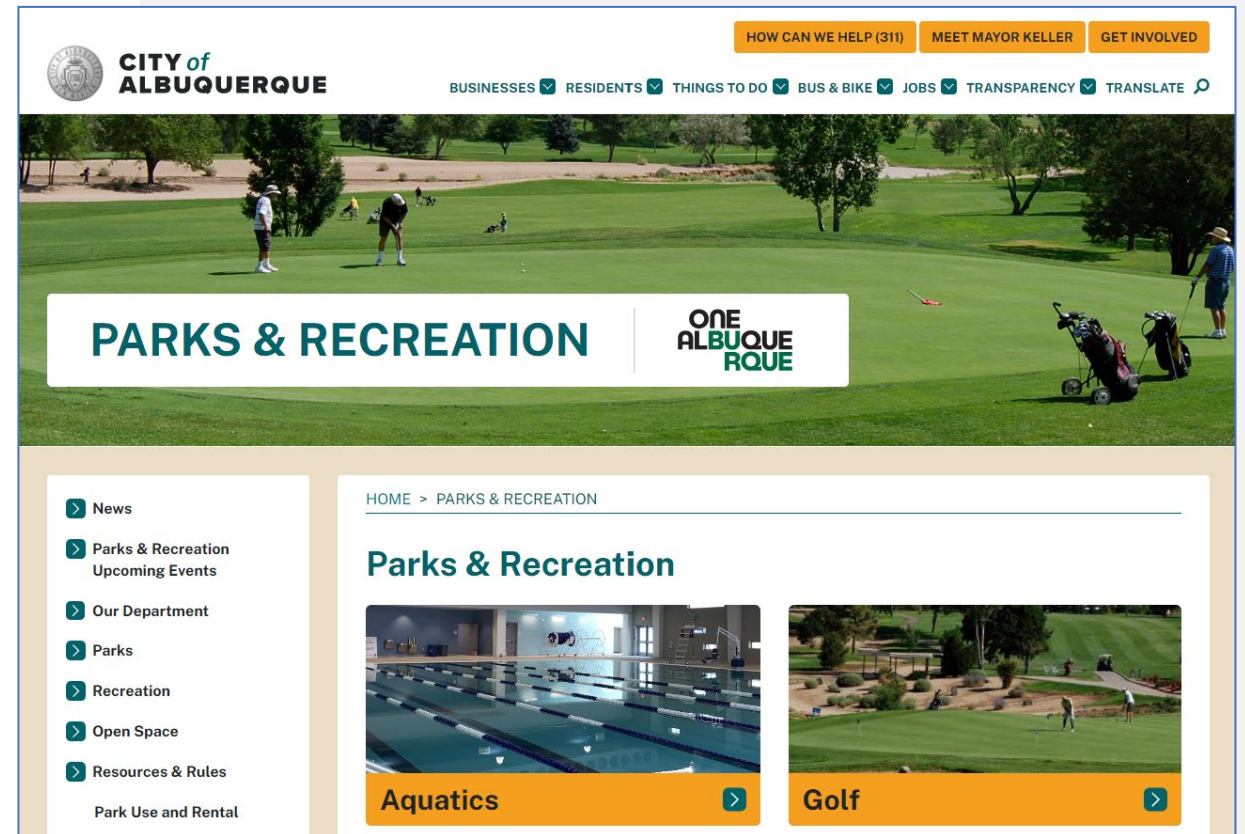

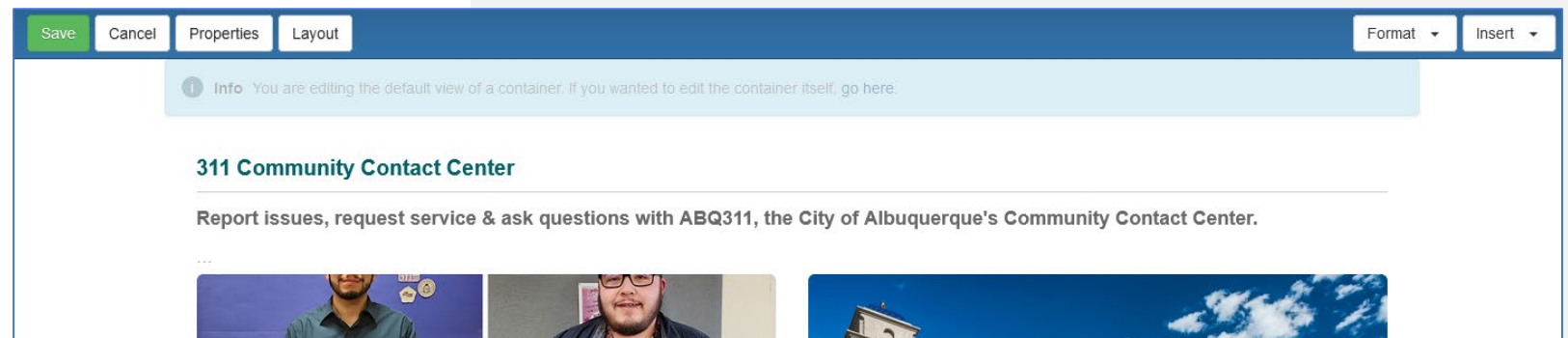

Understanding Homelessness as a Housing Issue

Affordability

Rent and home prices have risen in Albuquerque, especially since the pandemic. Lack of affordable housing development and income inequality compounds this problem. When people lack a strong safety net, losing a job, high medical expenses, or other unforeseen economic hardships can easily lead to homelessness.

Equity

Generational discrimination and disparity in who has access to housing has led to people of color making up a disproportionate share of the unhoused population relative to their census data in Albuquerque. We are still working to repair the historical trauma that has left our Native American population underserved and provide pathways to housing and home ownership for all marginalized groups.

Health

Physical and mental health challenges, including addiction, can be the result of or compounded by homelessness. We know that half of people experiencing homelessness have serious mental illness and 45% have a substance use disorder. The longer someone remains unhoused, the more help they will likely need to keep their housing.

Transit Plaza for quick connectivity across Albuquerque

Uptown Connect brings people to transit. The project will transform the aging and isolated transit center with a bustling transit plaza as the centerpiece of a mixed-use development. This important node in the transit system connects to the ART system and eight other bus routes, by which the community can reach nearly anywhere in the City in an hour or less.

The Uptown Transit Center will be activated in a new and improved way through the addition of commercial services and housing. Uptown
