<u>Public Comment</u> – *Reminder there is a 2 minute limit on Public Comment(s).* Althea Atherton: *read a poem regarding zero fares* Daniel Manzano: I want to get your vacancies filled. I've sent nine applications over to Transit staff for review. You can serve 2 consecutive terms.

TAB Chairperson's Report – Christopher Ramirez, Chair

Christopher Ramirez: I'd like to look at multiple approaches to make sure all people on busses and bus stops are safe. I'm still looking into the program Portland has for the Transit ambassadors. There's great concern around Transit Director transitions. I want to have a great leader in the role of Director in Transit. Councilor Sanchez brought up bus drivers not having breaks or lunches and I understand that was negotiated in their contracts. I don't feel safe on public transit now that mask mandate has been removed. I will follow up with Daniel regarding TAB vacancies.

Mag Kim: Shared stories collected on transit dependent riders. "Zero fares is awesome, I am currently homeless and using zero fares to go to my appointments" "It has helped my funds a lot"

Christopher Ramirez: Mayor included 1.5 million to continue zero fares through June 2023.

Director's Report-Sandra Saiz, Fixed Route Operations Manager

Sandra Saiz: Breaks and lunches for drives are a contractual item in 624 contract. MCO's have recovery time at the beginning and end of each trip. Zero Fares draft report is still being reviewed by administration. Ridership for paratransit 11,874 passengers with a 92.2% increase for February. Fixed route ridership 469,247 passengers with an increase of 31.6% for March. ART ridership 146,753 passengers with a 37.5% increase for March. *Transit org chart shared for viewing*

East downtown ART infrastructure scope of work was sent to HGR. They are putting together a design for a pin curb and we are waiting on that to come back.

Megan Holcomb: We will be receiving six interns for a seven week program with the first lady. These interns have chosen to do a study on Transit equity.

Sandra Saiz: Please join us on June 4 for bus stop clean up. We'd like to have three teams of ten.

Andrew DeGarmo: Clarifying pin curb infrastructure, we are asking for proposal, then design and construction at the end of the year.

Christopher Ramirez: How does neighborhood or community give input and recommendations for physical changes?

Andrew DeGarmo: Regarding pin curb, we haven't done neighborhood involvement in that.

Althea Atherton: Are driver's licenses required for all City jobs?

Sandra Saiz: Not all jobs require a driver license.

Patricia Salisbury: Can Sun Van drivers call dispatch to let them know I was ready, if customer Service is taking long to pick up the phone?

Sandra Saiz: We're experiencing high call volume and Sun Van drivers can't call dispatch to activate a call **Action Items:**

Althea Atherton: On graphs shared are their routes that double up?

Michelle Poyourow: We do try to account for places where two routes combine to offer a better frequency.

Andrew DeGarmo: There are routes that overlap each other but do not act together.
