## Resolution Urging the City of Albuquerque to Celebrate the Zero Fares Program August 8, 2024

**WHEREAS** the City of Albuquerque Transit Advisory Board (TAB) has passed resolutions in support of transit equity and zero-fare transit since 2018; and

**WHEREAS** frictionless, pass-free Zero Fares eliminates the need for fare checks and enforcement, easing the stress level and workload of our bus drivers in a time when the City of Albuquerque has experienced a bus driver shortage impeding service; and

**WHEREAS** a core tenant of transit equity is that transit dependent riders have access to transportation they need and continuously inform decisions about public transit; and

WHEREAS over 77% of weekday and 80% of weekend bus riders ranked keeping the bus free as Most Valuable or Valuable when asked about preferred improvements to bus service<sup>1</sup>; and

WHEREAS 76% of weekday riders and 79% of weekend riders report living in households making less than \$25,000 annually; and 61% of weekday passengers and 57% of weekend riders report that they do not possess a valid driver's license<sup>2</sup>; and

WHEREAS ridership has increased significantly since the inception of Zero Fares in 2022 and continues to rise steadily<sup>3</sup>; and

**WHEREAS** increased ridership has safety benefits by providing "more eyes on the street" for new and current riders alike; and

WHEREAS the Transit Department's monthly data dashboard shows a significant drop in security incidents on buses after Permanent Zero Fares became law; and<sup>4</sup>

**WHEREAS** the Transit Department's monthly data dashboard shows that most security incidents take place on bus platforms and at stops, not buses,<sup>5</sup>

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the TAB urges the City of Albuquerque to continue and celebrate the Zero Fares program in light of its success.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF,** the City of Albuquerque Transit Advisory Board (TAB) certifies this resolution and will share the resolution with the mayor and city councilors.
