We, the Municipal Canvass Board, made up of Natalie Y. Howard, the duly appointed and qualified City Clerk of the City of Albuquerque, New Mexico, and The Honorable Nancy J. Franchini, District Court Judge, for the County of Bernalillo, hereby certify that on the 6th day of October 2015, the Office of the City Clerk conducted a Regular Municipal Election. The purpose of the election was to vote for four (4) City Councilors and Twelve (12) General Obligation Bonds, Three (3) Charter Amendments and One (1) Tax Ordinance. The election returns from said election were canvassed by the Municipal Canvassing Board Pursuant to Section 3-8-53, N.M.S.A. 1978, on October 16, 2015. The results are as follows:

We further certify that from the canvass we ascertained that all General Obligation Bonds, numbered one (1) through twelve (12) passed, Charter Amendment Questions #1 and #3 passed and the Tax Ordinance passed.

The total number of registered voters eligible to vote in the Regular Municipal Election, October 6, 2015 was 350,119. The total number of voters was 28,408, resulting in a voter turnout of 8.11%.

The total number of signatures that will be required for voter initiatives proposed pursuant to Article III, Section 3 of the City Charter for the next municipal election will be more than 11,127 based on 20% of the average of the last four municipal elections, which is greater than 20% of the total voters for the October 6, 2015 election.

Franchini, District Court Judge, for the County of Bernalillo, hereby certify that on the 6th day of October 2015, the Office of the City Clerk conducted a Regular Municipal Election.

We further certify that from the canvass we ascertained that with the passage of Charter Amendment #1, the total number of signatures that will be required for voter initiatives proposed pursuant to Article III, Section 3 of the City Charter for the next municipal election will be more than 14,218 based on 20% of the number of voters who voted at the last regular municipal mayoral election, which was in 2013.
