On or about October 16, 2019, Respondent posted on its Facebook page an image inviting volunteers to join Respondent “as our field team works with Book [sic] Bassan’s campaign to canvas her City Council district in NE Albuquerque.” The image asked volunteers to show up at “10AM, SATURDAY OCTOBER 19TH.” (Ex. A)

On or about October 18, Brook Bassan, who is a candidate for City Council, posted a video on her campaign’s Facebook page in which she said, “[t]he other thing that I wanted to let you know, in addition to walking tomorrow, please message us if you want to meet. We’re going at 10AM.” (Ex. B)

On or about October 25, 2019, Respondent posted on its Facebook page to thank volunteers “for coming out yesterday and spending their valuable time to test out our cellular phonebanking system.” Respondent reported that they “were able to make a couple thousand calls,” and that, “twenty people were able to save the RNC, the Trump team, and our own state and local parties thousands of man hours and potentially millions of dollars in potentially lost productivity.” (Ex. C)

Also on or about October 25, 2019, Respondent again posted an image inviting volunteers to join Respondent “as our field team works with Book [sic] Bassan’s campaign to canvas her City Council district in NE Albuquerque.” That image asked participants to show up at “10AM, SATURDAY OCTOBER 26TH.” (Ex. D)

On or about October 30, 2019, Respondent published on its Facebook page a series of images depicting postcards encouraging voters to vote absentee for various Republican candidates, including Trudy Jones, Brook Bassan, and Peggy Muller-Aragon, in the local election taking place on November 5, 2019. (Ex. E)

The images show hundreds of postcard mailers apparently addressed to voters who had requested an absentee ballot for the local election. (Ex. F)

On or about November 6, 2019—the day after the local election—Respondent posted on its Facebook page that Respondent had worked to support three candidates in that election and that its goals during the election had included:

- Running an effective absentee ballot chase program
- Assisting candidates with walk-and-knock operations
- Pushing Republican voters to the polls with phonebanking

(Ex. G)

Toward that end, Respondent reported that its volunteers had:

knocked on doors for all three winnable campaigns, making thousands of direct voter contacts (and thousands of phone calls) to let voters know who their Republican candidates were.

(Id.)

The post then continued, noting that Brook Bassan is a candidate in the runoff election, and declaring:

It is the goal of the Republican Party of Bernalillo County to assist Brook in her efforts to get elected and to stop radical progressive policies from being implemented in Albuquerque. Election Day is December 10th and we're hitting the ground running.

(Id.)

That statement was followed by a solicitation of donations in order to “rally Republican voters who will begin voting again NEXT WEEK!” (Id.) And the post again invited volunteers to join Respondent, “as our field team works with Book Bassan’s campaign to canvas her City Council district in NE Albuquerque in the coming weeks.” (Id.)

More than five days has elapsed since the above-described events, although it also appears that Respondent is continuing to engage in similar activities during the ongoing runoff election. See (Ex. H, announcing “We’ll be running our easy-to-learn phonebanking operation from 10am to 4pm, every day of the week between now and 11/27”); see also (Ex. I, soliciting donations and insturcting “[i]f you can help knock on doors or make phonecalls to urge Republicans to vote, PLEASE contact us ASAP”)

Upon information and belief, Respondent has accepted contributions and made expenditures (both cash and in-kind) in excess of \$250.00 in connection with compiling an absentee voter mailing list, purchasing postcards and postage, producing content for mailers, sending campaign materials to voters in Bernalillo County, purchasing campaign software, generating walk-lists for canvassing, and canvassing on behalf of candidates.

Political parties choosing to participate in local, non-partisan election campaigns are subject to the same rules, ordinances and statutes as any other actor who advocates for or against a candidate or ballot measure. See, e.g., NMSA 1978, § 1-1-3.3 (2019) (defining “election-related organization” to not include qualified political parties in elections in which the party is not “represented on the ballot”).

Although more than five days have elapsed since all of the above-described activities, Respondent has failed to file a statement of formation or otherwise registered as a measure finance committee with the City Clerk as required by Section 6(a) and (c) of the Election Code.

Respondent has not reported any contributions or expenditures, either cash or in-kind, in connection with the above-described activities, as required by Section 4(c) of the Election Code.

In addition to the Facebook postings described above, Respondent has generally used its Facebook page to advocate for and against candidates running for office in the local election in November and in the runoff election taking place on December 10, 2019, as well as ballot measures at issue in the November election. Upon information and belief, Respondent has not submitted any of the above-described campaign materials to the City Clerk as required by Section 5 of the election code and by the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Ethics at § 7 B and D.

UPDATE ON VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES

We would like to thank all of our AMAZING volunteers for coming out yesterday and spending their valuable time to test out our cellular phonebanking system!

We had two goals:

- 1) Support our city council and school board candidates by making GOTV calls
- 2) Test out our system to make sure we understood its ins and outs during a low turnout election year to prepare for 2020

After two days of practice with the system we discovered some glitches, some technical difficulties, and some training issues (thank you AGAIN to our volunteers for their patience).

We were able to make a couple thousand calls, inform good Republican voters about their candidates, and let those voters know where and when to vote.

Even more importantly, we were able to identify a host of issues with the system and relay those to the RNC, the Trump team, and the system developers themselves.

At the end of the day, twenty people were able to save the RNC, the Trump team, and our own state and local parties thousands of man hours and potentially millions of dollars in potentially lost productivity (which equates to votes).

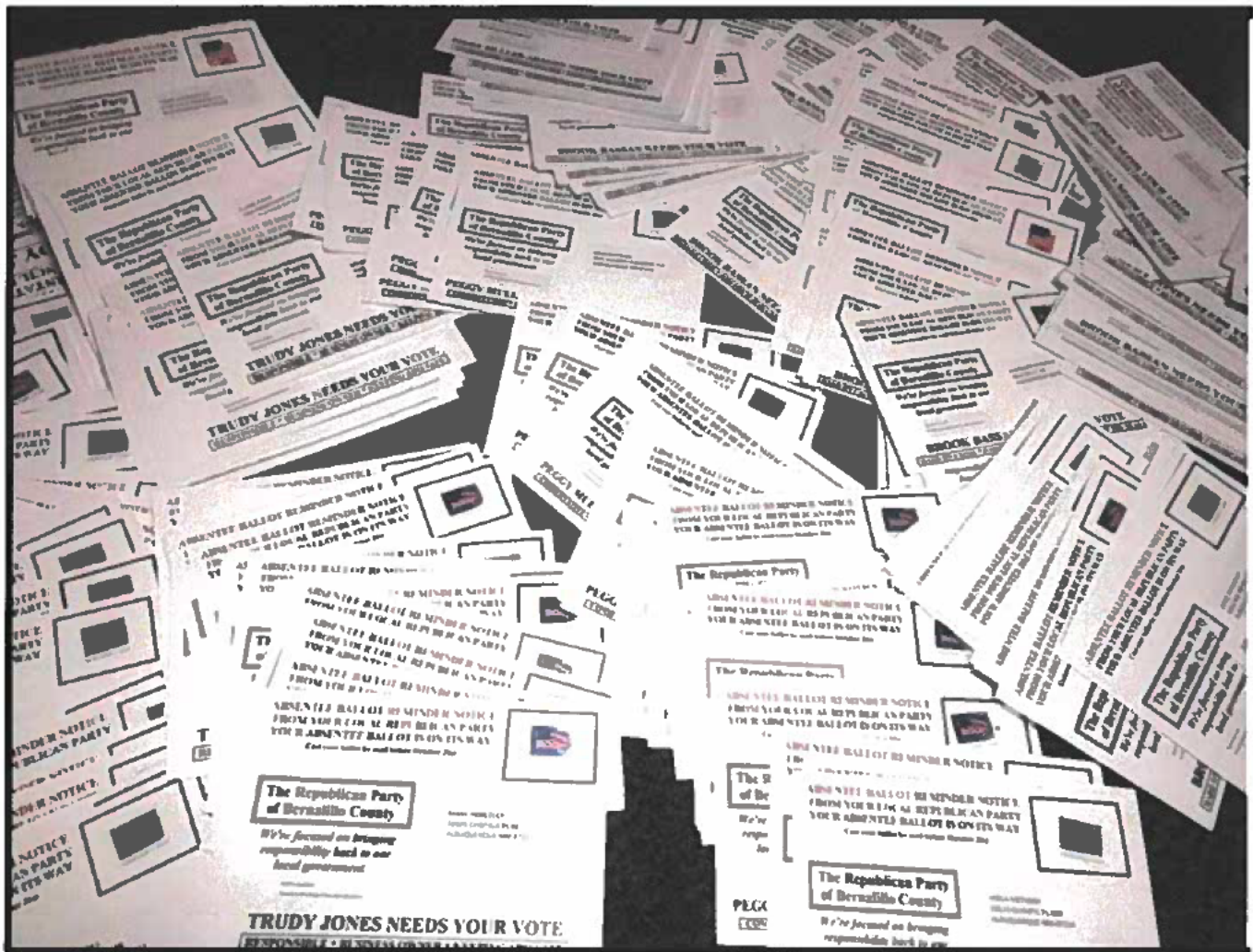

Election Success Recap and a Path Forward

Last night's election results were a breath of fresh air for Republicans in Bernalillo County!

"ABQ City Councilor Trudy Jones and APS Board Member Peggy Muller-Aragon both won re-election.

"ABQ City council candidate Brook Bassan won a hard-fought race and secured her position as front-runner in a December 10th runoff election.

The insidious left-wing activist-inspired 'Democracy Dollars' ballot initiative was defeated.

Our Bernalillo County Party's goals for this election were threefold:

- 1) Support our Republican candidates in winnable districts by:
 - Running an effective absentee ballot chase program
 - Assisting candidates with walk-and-knock operations
 - Pushing Republican voters to the polls with phonebanking

2) Test out our phonebanking system and make sure we understood its ins and outs during a low turnout election year to prepare for 2020

3) Inspire confidence in the Republican Party of Bernalillo County amongst volunteers, officeholders, candidates, and donors by demonstrating our operating capabilities

FIRST: Data-driven campaigning is essential in today's Republican Party. If we're able to effectively target and mobilize Republicans, we can turn out more voters. This is why our absentee ballot chase program was effective in their districts...

-Trudy Jones won over 64.5% of absentee votes

-Peggy Muller-Aragon won 59.2% of absentee votes

-Brook Bassan won 52.3% of absentee votes

These results are exceptional, especially considering the sheer volume of absentee ballots Democrat activists and organizers were gathering, as well as the amount of money spent to push overall turnout for the Democracy Dollars ballot initiative (we all remember CD2's 2018 outcome). Between these three candidates and the BCGOP, we had less than \$150,000. We were opposed by at least three times that amount of Democrat money!

SECOND: The Campaign Sidekick smartphone app RPNM has purchased got a thorough round of testing. We were able to effectively use it for walk-and-knock operations in urban areas (the more rural, the harder it is to utilize due to weaker cell reception). Again, we must give a HUGE THANK YOU to our volunteers for testing the phonebanking portion of the app. It had its hiccups and glitches, a host of which we were able to identify. Its difficulties involve: training volunteers to use the application on a large variety of smartphone models and operating systems; requiring a great degree of manual dexterity to use; requiring smartphone accessories (headphones) uploading voter data. If the application becomes more user-friendly and easier for volunteers to learn, it can become an important asset.

THIRD: It's extremely important to us that our volunteers, officeholders, candidates, and donors know that the Republican Party of Bernalillo County will respect their time, money, and reputations when we conduct operations. Our primary goal as a party is to help ensure that REPUBLICANS GET ELECTED.

This means the BCGOP will continue to:

- A) Use all of our resources as wisely as possible (donations and volunteer hours)
- B) Build the infrastructure that acts as a springboard for all Republican candidates.
- C) Communicate effectively with Republican voters in ways which help (and not hurt) our candidates; chances of being elected; flattening communications; accurate data and targeting; well-executed and timely messages.

Beginning today, November 6th, Brook Bassan's race for Albuquerque City Council District 4 is entering its runoff phase. 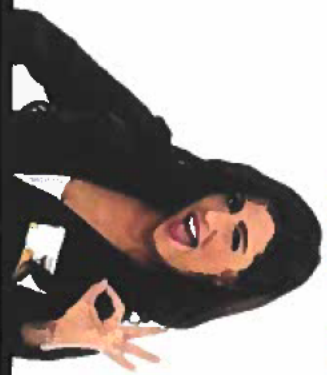
