Respondent is a candidate running for the position of Albuquerque City Councilor from District 4. I am a resident of Albuquerque and am aware of multiple campaign activities by her own campaign and outside groups that have not been properly reported by Respondent. The failures to report the in-kind contributions described below constitute violations of campaign spending limits.

COUNT 1: FAILING TO REPORT CAMPAIGN HEADQUARTERS

According to her own public communications, Respondent is utilizing a campaign headquarters for her campaign. She has not reported any expenses for this headquarters, which would make the headquarters an in-kind contribution. She has also failed to report this as an in-kind contribution in violation of city law.

COUNT 2: FAILING TO REPORT MAILERS AND PAID CANVASSING

Respondent has received thousands of dollars of help in the form of mailings and paid canvassing by multiple outside groups, including Ole', Working Parties of New Mexico, and A Better ABQ. She has never reported the value of these mailings as in-kind contributions.

Upon information and belief, Respondent is coordinating these mailers with these outside groups. The publicly disseminated mailings state that Respondent is utilizing the same printer (Don Mickey Designs) as these outside groups and that means those expenditures almost certainly are not "independent expenditures."

While this is not a federal election, the city's own election code mirrors the federal election code, particularly with respect to independent expenditures, coordinated expenditures, and in-kind contributions, so their regulations and interpretations are relevant and illuminating. Using the same printer triggers the "common vendor" standard under federal election law which makes these mailings coordinated and requires that they be reported as in-kind contributions. As the FEC's coordination regulations make clear, vendors that provide these services to candidates are considered to have access to information about the campaign plans, projects, activities, and needs of the candidate. Under the city law, this type of coordination means these expenditures must be reported as in-kind contributions and Respondent has failed to do so.

Respondent has also received canvassing help from multiple outside groups, including Ole, Working Families Party and others. These groups have reported expended funds to expressly advocate for Respondent, but Respondent has not reported any of these expenditures as in-kind contributions, despite the obvious coordination involved in their door-to-door activities.

COUNT 3: FAILING TO REPORT EMAIL AND SOCIAL MEDIA ADVERTISING

The Democratic Party of New Mexico (DPNM) has been promoting the Respondent's campaign via email and social media. DPNM invests thousands of dollars in these resources and using

them to expressly advocate for Respondent's campaign is a campaign expenditure. Respondent has failed to report these activities as in-kind contributions, in violation of city law.

Additionally, the Democratic Party of Bernalillo County is similarly promoting the Respondent's campaign digitally, including soliciting volunteers to come to the same locations and at the same time as Respondent's own campaign, which clearly constitutes coordination. Respondent has failed to report these activities as in-kind contributions, in violation of city law.

CONCLUSION

Upon information and belief and as stated above, Respondent has accepted in-kind contributions from multiple outside groups in the form of headquarter rental, voter lists, voter data, campaign software, printing and postage for multiple mailers and canvassing efforts in an aggregate amount that exceeds the applicable limits contained in Section 4(d) of the Election Code and Section 6(E) of the Open and Ethical Elections Code, and none of which has been reported by Respondent. Instead, Respondent is unlawfully accepting in-kind donations without reporting them as required by Section 4(c) of the Election Code.

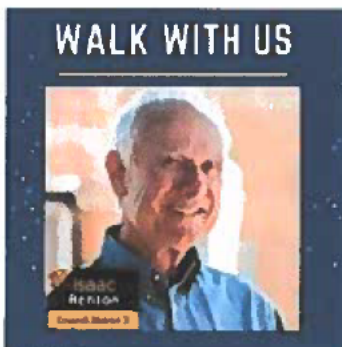

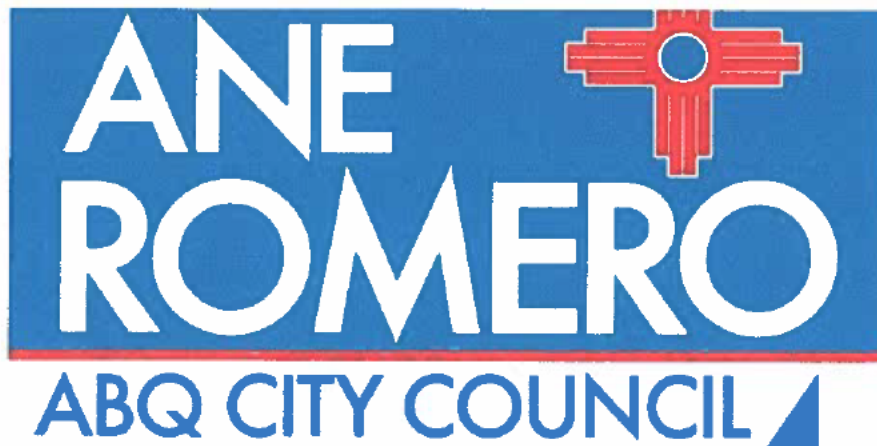

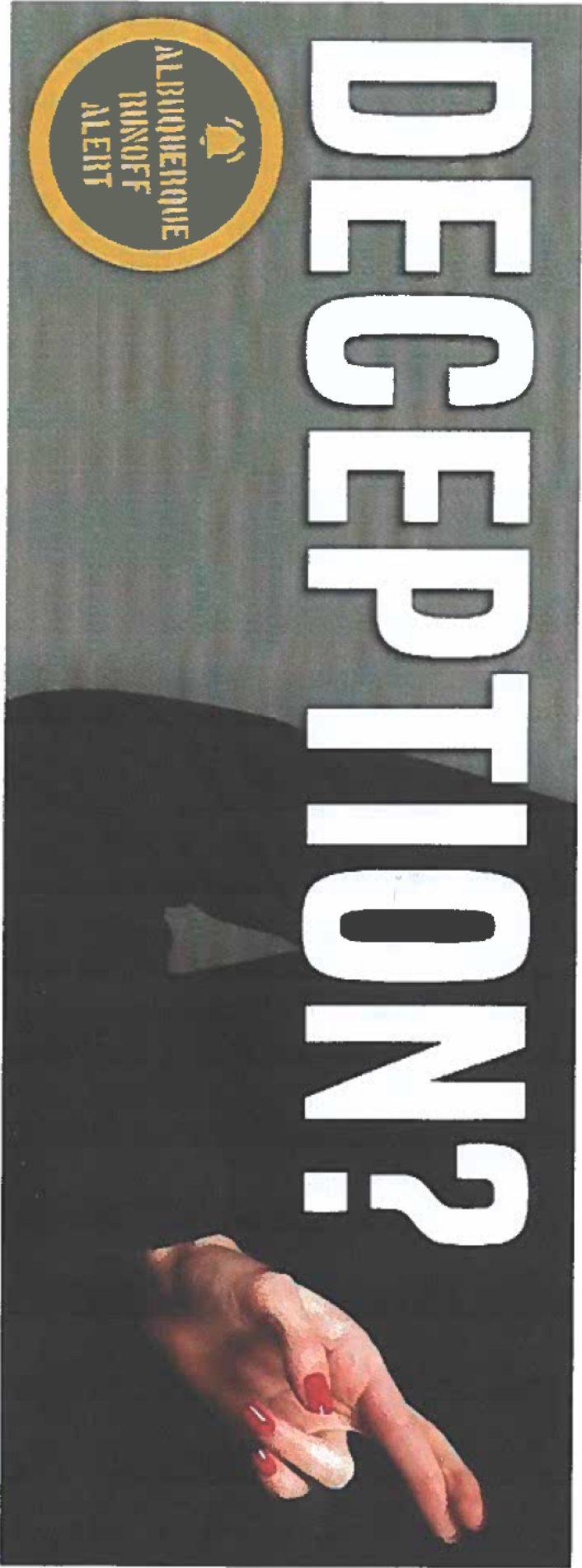

Is Albuquerque Council candidate Brook Bassan confused about what she stands for... or did she work to deceive voters?
